ACCELERATE THE GOSPEL

Twenty years ago, MTW leaders realized they needed to create a way to help missionaries fundraise for field projects.

Many missionaries have big ministry dreams but often churches in their field lack the resources and network to make them happen.

This is where you stepped in.

Since 2006, MTW Ambassadors have made these dreams a reality. By providing the startup capital needed for these strategic projects, MTW Ambassadors accelerate the mission.

This accelerates the gospel.

With Ambassadors funding, MTW missionaries don't have to spend years fundraising. They can get these projects off the ground and focus on getting the gospel message out in their communities.

The ripple effect has been more than you can imagine. As the gospel goes out, churches multiply sooner, leaders get trained faster, and entire communities are transformed by the Bible's message of hope.

To date, the MTW Ambassadors program has distributed over 990 grants worth \$26,874,373 in 98 countries.

YOUR GLOBAL IMPACT IN 2025

Ambassadors accelerate MTW's mission to make disciples among all nations by funding projects in three strategic categories.

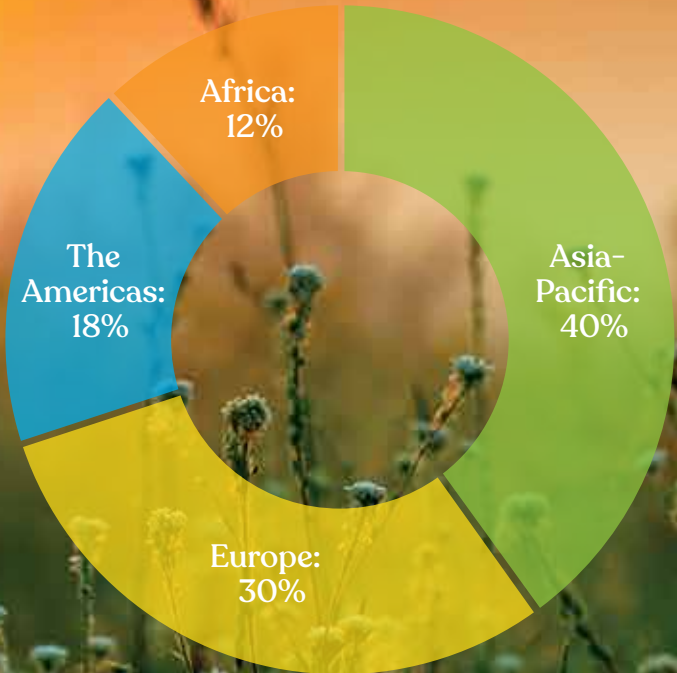
Planting Churches: Because the Church is God's primary means of extending His kingdom, planting theologically robust, multiplying churches is central to MTW's philosophy.

Developing Leaders: MTW missionaries are committed to educating and equipping pastors and lay leaders so that ministries and churches throughout the world can thrive and grow.

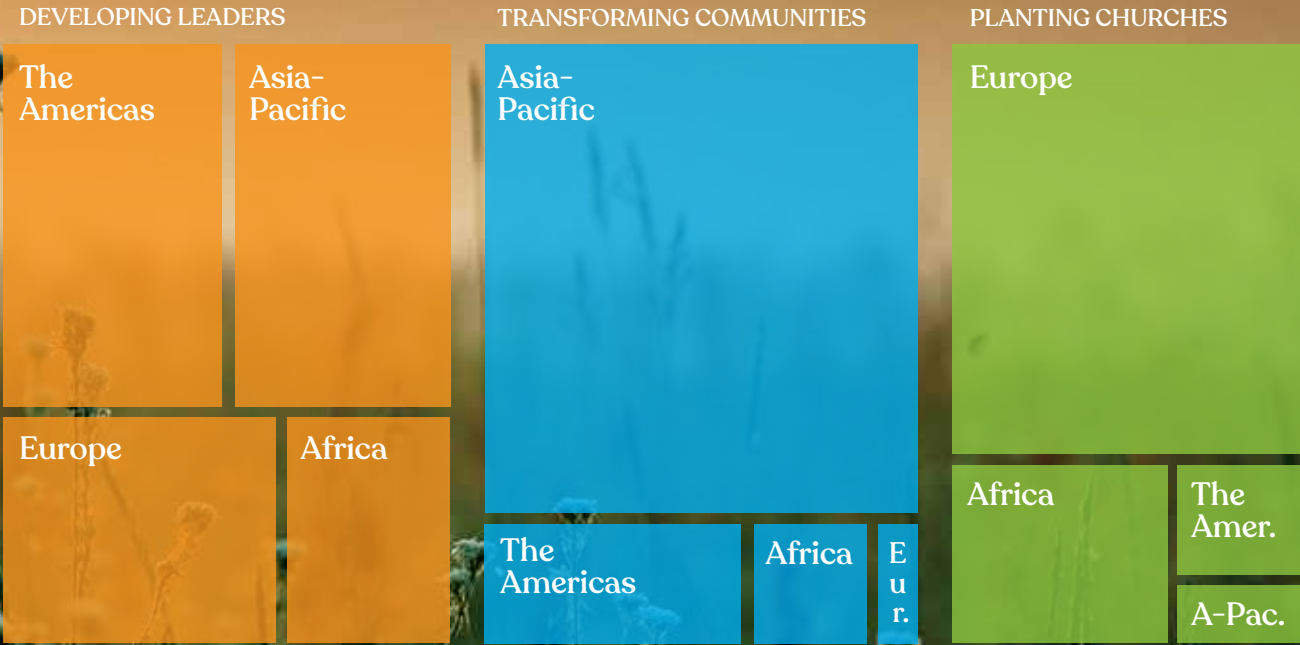
Transforming Communities: As God's kingdom agent, the Church is called to demonstrate God's kingdom ethics. This is why many MTW missionaries establish ministries of mercy and justice alongside their church planting work.

In 2025 Ambassadors gave 41 grants to 37 projects worth **\$1,044,393** in 28 countries.

2025 Giving by Ministry Category



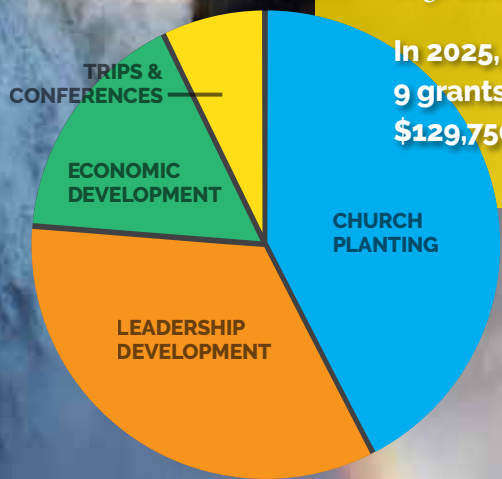
AFRICA

Africa

The rise of Christianity in sub-Saharan Africa has positioned the continent to become the world's next epicenter of Christianity. Yet the Church's growth is largely due to Pentecostal and prosperity gospel teachings, muddling the Bible's message of salvation through Christ alone.

The Church in Africa needs sound theological teaching and resources and you are helping provide them. Whether it is supporting economic development projects so that churches and pastors can become self-sustaining, training men and women called to church ministry, or helping church plants and presbyteries get on their feet, MTW Ambassadors are creating pathways for the true hope of the gospel to go forth.

In 2025, Ambassadors gave 9 grants to 8 projects worth \$129,750 in 9 African countries.



ACCELERATING THE GOSPEL on African College Campuses

Through the diligence of MTW and RUF, six RUF-Global ministries and seven African campus ministers serve on universities across the continent. But these ministers have not been able to get visas to attend RUF's U.S. staff training.

So MTW Ambassadors helped bring the training to them.



In February 2025, nearly 40 participants—including many African national partners—gathered in Cape Town, South Africa, for an RUF training focused on tools for their first year of ministry and RUF's philosophy of ministry. The gathering also fostered collaboration as campus ministers work together to reach and equip university students across Africa.

ACCELERATING THE MISSION Among Muslims in West Africa

Despite limited pastoral training, inadequate meeting spaces, and scarce financial support for church planters, the Church is taking hold in West Africa.

In 2025, Ambassadors helped missionaries and national partners overcome these challenges by:

1. Providing training for pastors in Senegal so they can start businesses to support their families and build bridges in their community.
2. Equipping under-sourced churches with sufficient internet to continue remote officer training.
3. Training two future church planters in the region.
4. Supporting church planting efforts among the unreached Wolof and Fulani people.

All said, your generosity strengthened 24 churches, advancing gospel ministry in this Muslim majority region of the world.

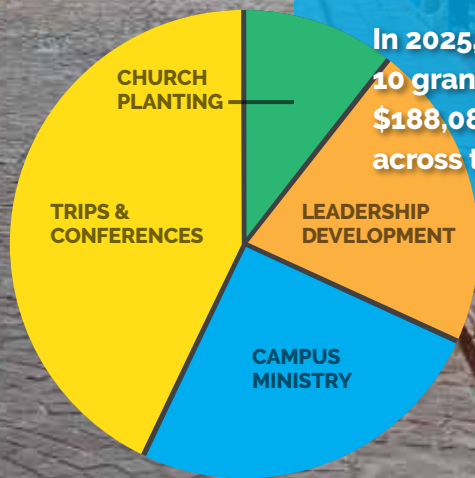

THE AMERICAS

Most sources classify North and South America as Christian continents. Yet a closer look at the Church tells a different story. Catholicism dominates much of Latin America, while Protestant churches in North America face decline. Millions of people have never personally encountered the hope found in Christ.

You are helping change that. From communities caught between drug cartels in Mexico, to those suffering instability in Haiti, to the ostracized First Nations and Native American tribes across North America, Ambassadors is empowering churches and missionaries to lead spiritually needy people throughout the Americas to the life-giving fountain of God's grace.



In 2025, Ambassadors gave 10 grants to 8 projects worth \$188,081 in three countries across the Americas.

ACCELERATING THE MISSION by Multiplying Churches in Mexico

Over the past five years, MTW Ambassadors have accelerated a church planting movement in Northwest Mexico leading to the first Reformed and Presbyterian church in 10 major cities.



Some of the churches are multiplying and 2025 Ambassadors grants supported the new church plants of Life Church in Durango and New Life Church in Monterrey. Thank you for helping build a foundation for the Church in a country that needs to be transformed by the gospel.

ACCELERATING THE GOSPEL to Unbelievers in El Salvador

“What does it mean that Jesus is the savior?” a student asked MTW El Salvador missionaries Rodney and Jana Davila during a Bible study. In a country whose name translates “The Savior,” the Davilas were surprised by the question.

But the girl’s question made sense. Though there is a large evangelical population in El Salvador, they preach a prosperity gospel. The Davilas explained that Jesus is our only hope to find peace with God.

El Salvador is a new MTW field Ambassadors have helped open. With Ambassadors support, the team is establishing residency and has started ministry outreach to make contacts for a future church plant and share the gospel with those like the university student.



ASIA-PACIFIC

As the largest continent, Asia is home to 60% of the world's population. It is also the least evangelized continent in the world with over 5,300 unreached people groups according to Joshua Project.

Yet God is on the move. Backed by Ambassadors, MTW missionaries are tilling the hard spiritual soil in Asian fields so that the gospel can take root. By supporting translation projects, seminaries, church plants, and mercy ministries, MTW Ambassadors have a hand in extending God's kingdom to a part of the world where many have never heard of it.

In 2025, Ambassadors gave 13 grants to 13 projects worth \$411,062 in 8 Asia-Pacific countries.



ACCELERATING THE MISSION to Vulnerable Girls in Cambodia

"It is good my mother sold me because if she didn't, I would never have known Jesus," Sreynich* told MTW missionary Laura Ambrose.

Sreynich's mom sold her to a wealthy Cambodian family as a house slave when she was 6. For five years, she was mistreated and sexually abused by the family. After an NGO rescued her, she lived at MTW's Dahlia Dorm where an MTW church plant embraced her and told her about Jesus. A few years ago, she put her faith in Christ.

Dahlia Dorm is MTW Cambodia team's home for girls ages 10-18 who have been rescued from human trafficking. There, they receive medical care, trauma recovery, a Christian education, and discipleship from a local church.

Many more girls need a place to go. With the help of an Ambassadors Grant, the team is opening a second dorm called Gemma's Garden where they can offer more girls like Sreynich the healing found in Christ.

ACCELERATING THE GOSPEL Deeper and Further in Japan



The Japanese are one of the largest unreached people groups in the world and Japanese Christians live isolated, counter-cultural lives. They have few opportunities to gather with a large group of believers.

This is why the "Deeper and Further" conference—hosted by MTW's Christ Bible Institute and sponsored by Ambassadors—was such an encouragement to attendees. Last fall, around 500 Christians gathered in Nagoya, Japan, for worship, connection, and to hear God's Word preached by Japanese pastors. One participant said that it was a dream to worship and fellowship with so many other believers while another couldn't believe how many Christians were in one place.

"The support from Ambassadors was essential for CBI to successfully pull off this event. We were able to keep the registration cost low which encouraged more group participation, which was a major goal of ours. We are immensely grateful to everyone involved in Ambassadors for their significant investment in this event and in the gospel going deeper and further throughout Japan!"

EUROPE

Over the past century, gospel understanding in Europe has declined almost to the point of extinction. Churches in France, Germany, Scotland, and England have shriveled and there is an entire generation growing up knowing next to nothing about Jesus.

Throughout the continent, MTW Ambassadors are providing the gospel's light in the sea of Europe's spiritual darkness. By investing in church plants, church revitalization projects, refugee and mercy ministries, and future leaders, Ambassadors are bolstering MTW missionaries and national partners in their uphill battle of making Christ's name known in places that have forgotten Him.

In 2025, Ambassadors gave 9 grants to 8 projects worth \$315,500 in 8 European countries.



ACCELERATING THE MISSION of Hope International Church in Belgium

Every Sunday, people from 30 nations worship together at Hope International Church, MTW's church plant in Brussels, Belgium. Some people's



home countries are at war but, as MTW Brussels missionary Daniel Brink says, "In the body of Christ diversity finds unity."

The church is dreaming of expanding their ministry by launching an RUF ministry, developing interns and future pastors, planting more churches, and welcoming newcomers. There is one problem—they don't have space.

Thanks to an Ambassadors matching grant, they have the opportunity to buy a building in the city-center, empowering them to pursue their ministry goals and continue reaching the nations living in the international city of Brussels with the gospel.

ACCELERATING THE GOSPEL Through Theological Resources in Poland

Since it began in 2015, Christ the Savior Presbyterian Church, an MTW partner church in Krakow, Poland, has been committed to the spiritual growth of individual believers and the strengthening of the Polish Church. To that end, they started a publishing ministry to address the country's shortage of theological resources.

They can't do it alone. Your gifts help fuel the church's new ministry initiatives including the publication of the first ever study Bible in Polish, "The Reformation Study Bible."

"We know this translation will be an encouragement for deeper growth in the understanding of God's Word as this will bring Reformed theology to the public in an accessible way. The exegetical



comments of the study Bible and the background information will bring theology to the everyday Bible reading of the regular Polish believer."
